Production notes:

The stage is bare apart from two straight backed chairs at C.

Both women are late middle aged and are well dressed in black. The waitress is dressed formally.

Time: 1980's

# Well I Never!

Both women are seated DC on straight backed chairs. They occasionally sip sherry from glasses.

- W1: He was a nice man.
- W2: Yes, a nice man.
- W1: I don't mean just nice. You know, he was a nice man.
- W2: I know, I know what you mean.
- W1: Yes, well respected.
- W2: Course he was.
- W1: Salt of the earth.
- W2: Yes. You're right, absolutely.

#### Pause

- W1: Funny that.
- W2: What's that then?
- W1: Salt of the Earth. It's a funny saying don't you think?
- W2: Yes. Salt of the sea or salt of the cellar but not....

- W1: (interjecting) Cellar?
- W2: Yes, you know, salt cellars.
- W1: I've always called them pots.
- W2: Pots, cellars, doesn't matter does it?
- W1: No, I suppose not, but it's a funny phrase. Not very...
- W2: (interjecting) Nice?
- W1: Complimentary, I'd say.
- W2: That's it, that's the word.

The waitress enters R with a tray of sherry glasses. She offers drinks to the women. They return empty one to the tray and take full ones. The waitress smiles and exits L

- W1: He was though wasn't he?
- W2: What wasn't he?
- W1: (*slightly irritated*) Salt of the earth.
- W2: Oh! Yes he was, salt of the earth.
- W1: An upstanding gentleman.
- W2: Definitely upstanding.

Pause

- W1: Not any more though.
- W2: What d'yer mean?

W1: Upstanding.

W2: No, not any more, poor man.

Pause

W2: How's she taking it?

W1: Who?

W2: Her.

W1: Oh, her? She's devastated.

#### Pause

- W1: Well, she would be wouldn't she?
- W2: What's that then?
- W1: What's what?
- W2: Why would she be, er...?
- W1: Devastated?
- W2: Yes, devastated.
- W1: Wouldn't you be?
- W2 is a little confused
- W2: I really don't know.
- W1: Not wed were they.
