Cast of Characters

STEVE: Oldest half-brother. Internationally-known magician. He knows the pain of grief all too well. He loves his family unconditionally.

<u>TUCKER</u>: Middle half-brother. A recently unemployed average joe. He basically inherited two brothers and resents them. He hides his pain through humor and being a jerk.

<u>ELLIOT</u>: Youngest half-brother. Middle school teacher. He is married with children, which is something he's always wanted. He adores his brothers and thinks the trip will help everyone.

<u>ROGER</u>: Head ranger of the park. He's very serious about his duties and rules of the park. He also turns into a completely different person when he sees Steve.

<u>CHARLIE</u>: The newest park ranger. Has an extremely loud voice. Has held dozens and dozens of odd jobs that bring a unique perspective to life.

<u>RILEY</u>: Madly in love with Sawyer. Postponed dreams so Sawyer could finish law school. Is one of the biggest fans of Steve. And it shows.

<u>SAWYER</u>: Relationship with Riley is the textbook example of two people in love. Wants to give Riley the world. Is the straight-forward, sensible one.

Setting

A state park that has seen an uptick in bear sightings. Entire play takes place in one location, with a few bits taking place off-stage.

Time

Present day.

Act I "Bear-ly grieving"

Scene 1

SETTING:

Mid-day. A clearing that is perfect for camping. Tree trunks on the ground along with a campfire set up in the middle, with sleeping arrangements tucked into a corner. There are a number of bags on the ground alongside two coolers and three rolled up sleeping blankets.

AT RISE:

Some type of conversation about bears can be heard in the distance.

A rather small and dinky tent is being set up. All that can be seen is the backside and legs of the younger brother while he attempts to set things up. ELLIOT is also absentmindedly singing the instructions of putting the tent up, a sign of a man with two young children.

ELLIOT

You put the one pole in... you push this other part out, you try to connect this other thing to this other thing and not have everything fall down...

(Two men approach the campsite. TUCKER is carrying a big bundle of firewood, enough to cover his face. STEVE is carrying two small pieces of wood and juggling them. STEVE stops dead in his tracks when he hears the singing and sees what is

going on. TUCKER runs
into him.)

TUCKER

Ooof, dude!

(STEVE is almost giggling.)

Is that singing?! (he says peeking around the pile.)

ELLIOT

Aaaaaaaaaand now I am almost finished with my masterpieceeeeeee!

(The two brothers set the firewood down and continue to watch, trying to muffle any loud laughter.)

STEVE

(singing in falsetto)

Do you call that a masterpieceeeeeeeeee?!

(This startles ELLIOT, who rises up inside the tent, collapsing it. The other brothers laugh and start organizing the firewood.)

ELLIOT

Really funny you guys. I was almost finished! By the way, that singing... a little too pitchy for my tastes.

STEVE

(saying and acting as a

stage magician)

Hey Elliot, look! I just made all this firewood APPEAR!

(TUCKER glares.)

ELLIOT

(clapping)

Bravo! Bravo! Encore!

(STEVE and ELLIOT both laugh)

TUCKER

(looking over at the

mess of a tent.)

Hey, we were gone a long time and you only worked on that one tent? Guess we need to do the other tents ourselves.

ELLIOT

Haha, what? It's just the one.

STEVE

(perking up)

You're joking right? Three of us in that thing? Are we going to stack up? That baby tent is barely half the size of me! (looking over at all the stuff they carried into the site) You're telling me we carried all this crap up here and you only brought one tent?!

ELLIOT

I thought it could be like the old days! Remember that camping trip we took when I was a kid? That was great!

STEVE

(Tearing through the

bags)

Two coolers of food, a bag and a half of clothes, four chairs, a stuffed animal... wait... 4 chairs?

TUCKER

(Just watching this unfold and laughing. He then turns into a character to mock Steve's stage magician bit from earlier)

Ladies and gentlemen, Elliot has made sleeping comfortably this weekend literally... DISAPPEAR!

(Takes a dramatic bow)

ELLIOT

Figuratively. Literally would mean that I...

(TUCKER flips him off.)

ELLIOT

It's just one night.

STEVE

I wish you would have just let me rent a cabin or something more... comfortable.

ELLIOT

The last time we did this, we just sat around and talked with each other. I just thought the three of us could really use that right now.

TUCKER

OK, Dr. Phil.

STEVE

(laughing)

Good one.

ELLIOT

Don't you remember? It was Fall and just a little cold. We were all afraid of grizzly bears. So you guys made sure to build a bear-proof camp fire. And it worked, no bears. I mean, it also incinerated every s'more we tried to make.

(STEVE smiles as he remembers, TUCKER is almost trying to stifle any sort of happiness.)

You guys talked about girls. A LOT. Tuck told that ghost story about the guy with the hook for a hand. Steve tried to make us believe there were zombie grizzly bears out to eat our spleens... we all just had a traumatic experience. We could just use that right now.

TUCKER

(matter of factly)

I for one think we don't need any zombie bears trying to eat our spleens right now.

ELLIOT

(annoyed)

Being. Together. Us and the fresh air. No distractions. Just a little bit of time to... to be together before you guys leave. We're brothers after all.

TUCKER

(extra emphasis on the

first word)

HALF-brothers.

(Both STEVE and ELLIOT react at the same time.)

STEVE

Don't.

ELLIOT

Why do you always flipping do that? (trying to get things back on track) Did Dad ever take you camping?

TUCKER

Flipping? Really?

ELLIOT

You know I don't curse.

TUCKER

(taking a moment, then like he's being forced)

There was a boy scout overnight trip once. It was up in the mountains. I remember it was this massive clearing. All of us wanted to go explore, but my... our father just wanted to sit and drink beer.

(STEVE appears to have never heard this story before. Sits down watching TUCKER, almost with a surprised look on his face.)

It was fun once I realized he wasn't going to do anything. Guess I learned an important life lesson that day.

(A couple of beats of silent contemplation.)

ELLIOT

So it wasn't all bad then.

TUCKER

Actually, no. I still have some pretty vivid memories from that trip. I think it helped that there were a lot of kids my age all doing the same thing, getting into trouble and having fun.

(TUCKER chuckles to himself)

There were these two kids walking in the woods, they didn't see me. I start barking like a dog and scared them good. I think one of them may have even peed their pants.

STEVE

OK, that I can believe.

TUCKER

I think that trip helped me fall in love with the outdoors.

ELLIOT

So you do love being out here with us.

TUCKER

I didn't say that.

STEVE

(Sarcastically)

And you never have to.

ELLIOT

Steve?

(A few more beats.)

STEVE

Oh, uh... No. The closest thing we ever got was little league. My mom's idea. He didn't want to be there. I didn't want to be there. It was not a fun experience.

TUCKER

Now this sounds like a dad story.

STEVE

When he got frustrated, he made us all do laps. This group of little kids was more of a cross country team with the number of laps we had to run. The best part of those times was for about 30 seconds of each lap there was silence, I couldn't hear him barking orders at us.

TUCKER

He took me to the park once and did the exact same thing. Now I think he was just quickly trying to tire me out.

STEVE

My mom knew I hated it, but she told me that once we make a commitment we need to stick to it to the end. But, in the end, she took me to Toys 'R' Us and let me get whatever I

wanted. Her way of making me feel better about the whole thing, I guess.

(A quick beat.)

(*smiling*) It was this massive magic set. It had everything: card tricks, cups with hidden compartments, a magic wand that had hidden flowers inside, a never ending handkerchief.

ELLIOT

That's great.

STEVE

That experience started everything. I remember she would be so happy when I tried to show her a trick.

(The other two feel bad.)

ELLIOT

She sounds like an amazing mom.

STEVE

She was.

(Lights down on the brothers. At a point away from them, a young couple emerges, could be in the crowd etc. Both are wearing hiking gear. RILEY and SAWYER are just finishing up what appears to be a romantic lunch. Both are very happy and madly in love.)

SAWYER

This was such a good idea. Thank you for forcing me to come today.

RILEY

I know how hard you've been working with the new firm. You really just needed a day to get away from everything. Except me. That chain is locked up tight.

SAWYER

I wouldn't have it any other way.

(SAWYER and RILEY share a quick kiss. Both start to pack up while they talk.)

RILEY

(Playfully) Goofball.

SAWYER

You have given up so much for me while I finished all the schooling and passing the bar. I just express how much that means to me.

RILEY

You never have to. We both knew going into this that we would be there to help each other out. Thick and thin.

SAWYER

I feel like I should have got you a mug that says your turn on it. Engraved with a date or something.

RILEY

This will do just fine. I'll take a stunning mental image and remember this day.

(SAWYER does a fake photo pose.)

SAWYER

I know doing real estate was never your passion. But, it did open up a door to what you really love. That counts for something, right?

RILEY

Always looking on the bright side. That's why I love you. Who knew taking photos of empty houses would get me to love photography.

SAWYER

I could just stare at you all day. You... amaze me.

RILEY

Always waxing poetic about things. You can make anything sound amazing. And I'm here like "Sawyer is good."

SAWYER

Riley is good.

RILEY

If this was a reality show, people would be saying "awww" right now.

(SAWYER notices something in the distance and picks up some binoculars.)

SAWYER

Oh, wow. You are not going to believe this. Babe, I think it might be a Red-breasted nuthatch!

RILEY

(flipping to the "R" section of the bird manual)

A nuthatch? That would be the first sighting for us!

SAWYER

I know! So exciting!

(putting down the binoculars and staring right into Sawyer's eyes)

I love you. Let's get a closer look.

RILEY

Looks like there is a campsite near there. Let's try to cut through quietly.

SAWYER

Look at you, always so polite. And cute.

(Both hold hands and make their way toward the brother's campsite. Back to the brothers, mid-conversation.)

TUCKER

So what if the kids hear you drop an F-bomb or two, it's not going to scar them for life.

(The couple walks onstage. They are not close to the brothers, but both groups can see each other. The couple seems oblivious to the other people, they are looking for the bird.)

RILEY

I think I saw it over here.

SAWYER

A Red-breasted nuthatch! A fantastic find!

(Both use the same pair
of binoculars to look
for the bird. Can be
cute like each using one
of the eyeholes or one
playfully strangling the
other to look. SAWYER is
laughing and spins
around using them and
gets a close up look at
STEVE.)

Uh...

RILEY

What? Did you find it?

(SAWYER is somewhat stunned and yammering a bit.)

SAWYER

I think that is a celebrity.

(RILEY looks over and realizes what SAWYER saw.)

RILEY

(Very loudly) No way.

TUCKER

Incoming. We are about to have visitors.

(RILEY runs over, followed by SAWYER. Even though STEVE sees them

coming he is still
startled.)

RILEY

Oh... my... God. I love YOU!

STEVE

Thanks?

RILEY

The time you sawed the Great Wall of China in half. It was a thing of beauty.

SAWYER

(motions to RILEY) Big fan.

STEVE

Well, it's nice to meet you... uh?

RILEY

Oh, I'm Riley, this is Sawyer. Can I just say when you escaped the strait-jacket inside that locked tank of water inside the burning building. Perfection!

STEVE

Thank you.

TUCKER

What's with the binoculars, you two stalking us? You a (obviously saying it wrong) papirazzo?

(RILEY is nervously giggling)

SAWYER

Oh, no, no. We were bird watching. We were looking for a nuthatch.

TUCKER

People still do that? We haven't seen any nuthatches, but Steve here is a nutcase.

SAWYER

(Ignoring the attempted

joke)

Sure. Well, it's my hobby, but RILEY is a great partner and supports me.

ELLIOT

Awww, how long have you been married?

RILEY

Eight years this November.

ELLIOT

Wow, what's your secret?

SAWYER

We always talk through our issues. And we find something fun in each other's hobbies. Riley likes collecting art, so we turned bird watching into a collection of sorts.

STEVE

(To SAWYER)

What's your big hobby?

RILEY

It's embarrassing.

STEVE

I promise not to tell anyone.

RILEY

You know all those sleazy reality shows? I LOVE them. Can't get enough of them.

SAWYER

And I write down my angry commentary about them for a blog.

RILEY

Have you seen 'The Valley of the Bros'?

(All three brothers

shake their heads no.)

'Stalking the Stalker'? 'Date me, NOW!'? 'Cornucopia of Dudes'?

(All three just stare as

if to say 'these can't

be real'?)

You have to know about 'Sex Peninsula' right?

(TUCKER perks up)

TUCKER

I know that one! So good.

(STEVE and ELLIOT just learned this about their brother and they are in shock.)

Shut up, Kate watches them. And... I'm... supporting her.

ELLIOT

So that actually works?

SAWYER

Big time. We support each other with everything.

STEVE

Sounds exhausting.

(RILEY is still staring at STEVE.)

SAWYER

We don't do everything together. We give each other space when needed. I'm a lawyer and Riley is a real estat... photographer. Different people coming together...

TUCKER

Oooh. To form a giant robot!

SAWYER

What?

ELLIOT

Ignore him.

SAWYER

In all seriousness, I look at Riley and I smile. It's like my heart fills up and gives me a feeling of being invincible. And it could be anything, something simple like watching TV or going for a walk. I can look over and immediately get that feeling. And that feeling just powers me to want to be the best friend, lover and partner. I would do anything for Riley.

(RILEY looks to melt into a giant puddle of Aww)

RILEY

Awww.

ELLIOT

That was sweet and beautifully poetic.

TUCKER

People actually talk like that?

STEVE

Again, ignore him. (to RILEY) I think it was very sweet.

RILEY

(Embarrassed. To STEVE) Can I ask you a question? It's kind of personal.

TUCKER

Oh, please ask.

STEVE

(Glares at TUCKER, before turning to smile at SAWYER)

Sure.

RILEY

Um... haha, um... are you still dating that fried chicken heiress?

(TUCKER has the biggest "Oh my God" smile on his face.)

STEVE

Oh, no. That didn't quite work out. Don't tweet that, please.

RILEY

Your secret is safe with us!

STEVE

It's not really a secret. But, thank you.

(SAWYER turns to RILEY, very excited)

RILEY

I just had a moment with Steve Sanderstone!

SAWYER

Your illusions and magic, we both enjoy together. You just made Riley's year.

STEVE

Thanks?

TUCKER

And you made my year as well.

RILEY

(To Tucker)

Are you married?

TUCKER

No.

STEVE

He has a girlfriend. They've been together for years.

TUCKER

She's a roast beef heiress.

SAWYER

You should work on your sarcasm.

(ELLIOT laughs.)

TUCKER

Fair. She's a nurse.

SAWYER

And your delivery.

TUCKER

What?! I'm not the one on trial here! Hey, Elliot is married with two little kids!

ELLIOT

(Nodding and smiling)

Five years. Want to see some pictures?

(ELLIOT pulls his wallet out and shows pictures of his family.)

SAWYER

See, he means what he says.

RILEY

What a lovely family. (Looks to STEVE) You must be the fun uncle!

ELLIOT

He is. The kids adore him.

STEVE

That's me, I'm a funcle.

RILEY

Awww, that means you're going to be a great father!

TUCKER

(excited?)

Woah! A bright blue bird!

ELLIOT

I didn't see any bi...

(Tucker smacks him as if to say shut up.)

SAWYER

Where?!

TUCKER

Over there. (points in a direction) Between those two trees.

RILEY

It could be a Steller's Jay?

SAWYER

We should be going.

RILEY

Oh, can we please get an autograph?

STEVE

Of course! (Reaches into his wallet) In fact, I had these special magic cards made for my biggest fans.

(RILEY geeks out more as STEVE signs them.)

RILEY

Today is the greatest day.

STEVE

(handing the cards over)

It was such a pleasure meeting you both. I wish you the best.

(SAWYER sneaks in a hug. And a quick selfie.)

TUCKER

Another blue bird!

SAWYER

Thanks again!

(RILEY is just staring at STEVE. SAWYER has to playfully grab RILEY'S hand. Both walk briskly hand in hand off-stage.)

ELLIOT

I didn't see any birds.

TUCKER

Yeah, me neither.

ELLIOT

(Still not getting it)

That was mean.

STEVE

(Obviously getting it)

Thanks, Tuck.

ELLIOT

I thought they were nice. It is great to see people in love and in such a great relationship.

TUCKER

This feels like some kind of forced segue. Is this the point where we are going to talk about our relationships?

STEVE

Don't look at me.

ELLIOT Yes. TUCKER Sigh. STEVE Sigh. ELLIOT So, love. TUCKER Pass. STEVE Pass. ELLIOT You can't pass. TUCKER Fine, skip me. STEVE Uh, reverse. Back to Tucker. TUCKER This isn't some kind of card game! STEVE Draw four? (Everyone laughs) ELLIOT You know, it's a wonder any of us turned out even halfway normal considering dad's relationships. TUCKER Skip. ELLIOT I'm serious. TUCKER

So am I.

STEVE

He's got a point, Tucker.

(TUCKER glares at STEVE.)

And it is something that we all avoid talking about.

TUCKER

For good reason!

ELLIOT

Come on, we need to get this stuff out in the open. We can't keep just avoiding the past.

TUCKER

I can.

STEVE

Yeah, you're doing a bang-up job with it too.

TUCKER

Like you're the expert in this situation?

ELLIOT

Guys.

TUCKER

Fine. Our dad was a womanizer. Is that what you want to hear?

STEVE

We all have different mothers, I think that point is glaringly obvious, Tuck.

ELLIOT

How old were you when your mom divorced him, Steve?

STEVE

Five.

ELLIOT

For cheating?

STEVE

Maybe. My mom never said anything to me before she died. My grandma thought so. Dad never wanted to talk about it.

ELLIOT

Why?

STEVE

They divorced and five years later she was dead. I think he always felt... guilty in some way.

(Saying the word "guilty" carries a lot of weight and should be seen physically.)

TUCKER

Good.

ELLIOT

I know you don't talk about that time a lot. It must have been hard.

(TUCKER is quietly fuming.)

STEVE

No, it's OK. I was extremely lucky. Tucker's mom accepted me right away into their family.

ELLIOT

(Counting in his head, maybe with a few

fingers)

Five years, then another five. Wait, was your mom the reason...

TUCKER

NO!

STEVE

No.

ELLIOT

(Embarrassed)

OK, sorry.

STEVE

She really didn't have to, but she treated me like a son right away. I guess the whole needing stability thing. Probably saved my life.

TUCKER

(Muttering)

Yay.

STEVE

Everything was fine, great actually. Seemed like the perfect family. Perfect marriage.

(TUCKER scoffs, they

ignore him.)

Until...

ELLIOT

(looking down)

Me.

STEVE

It wasn't you. Dad was probably unfaithful before meeting your mom. He just got caught that time.

TUCKER

And too stupid to be careful.

STEVE

Tuck. (Looks at ELLIOT) Again, not your fault.

ELLIOT

I know. Why do you think he was the way he was?

(TUCKER stands up like he wants to say something, but Steve cuts him off.)

STEVE

Who really knows. Maybe he just didn't like being content?

ELLIOT

But, she stayed with him?

(STEVE looks at TUCKER with a look like 'calm down.')

STEVE

The whole thing was complicated. She told me once that she didn't want Tucker to go through a divorce like I did.

TUCKER

I'm right here. I can speak for myself.

STEVE

Calm down.

ELLIOT

It's fine, Tucker.

STEVE

And then me losing another home. I think it was extremely brave of her to do that.

TUCKER

You would.

ELLIOT

But, did she divorce him?

TUCKER

When I graduated high school. Literally the day after.

ELLIOT

No.

STEVE

Literally the day after.

ELLIOT

Well... good for her.

(TUCKER gets up and huffs off to mess with the tent or something else to get him out of the conversation.)

STEVE

He'll be fine.

ELLIOT

We're all experts at avoiding this stuff, aren't we?

STEVE

Runs in the family.

(ELLIOT gives a half-hearted smile.)

Tucker never talks about stuff. Give him some time, he'll come around.

ELLIOT

I know, it's why I wanted us to do this trip. It's not good for him. For any of us.

STEVE

Can I say something personal?

ELLIOT

Of course.

STEVE

You deserve a lot of credit. Your situation growing up was tough and you're the one married with kids and making it work.

ELLIOT

It's all I've ever wanted. When my mom found out she was pregnant she was so excited to start a family with dad. Then she found out she was the mistress in the situation. She ended it that moment.

(STEVE is nodding in support. TUCKER is still off doing whatever.)

She said she was not going to ruin someone else's family. Of course she still looked like the bad guy. Everyone was talking behind her back. Big town turned out to be smaller than everyone thought.

STEVE

I can't imagine.

ELLIOT

It's why she moved in with my grandparents. New place, new life. She didn't date or anything until I was in college. Can you believe that? She said she wanted me to know I was the most important person in her life.

STEVE

Wow.

ELLIOT

So for as long as I can remember, I've always wanted to be married with kids. And thank you for the house with the

white picket fence, really helped locking in that classic family ideal.

STEVE

(Smiles)

Anything for family.

ELLIOT

It's not easy, you know.

STEVE

Having a white picket fence?

ELLIOT

Marriage. I bet you \$100 Sawyer and Riley fight.

STEVE

Yeah, like who gets to hold the remote. Or who wears the binoculars in that relationship.

ELLIOT

I'm serious. It takes a lot of work. But, it's worth it. Maybe dad just didn't get that last part. Your mom. Tuck's mom. It just sounds like things were great. And he just kept screwing it up.

STEVE

So what keeps you from becoming dad?

ELLIOT

Jen is my partner. I love her. She is everything to me. There is no one else on the planet that I would want to be with.

(TUCKER speaks out loud from where he is.)

TUCKER

How do you know unless you met every single woman on the planet?

ELLIOT

When you've met perfection, you don't need to look any further.

(ELLIOT looks down.)

STEVE

What's wrong? That's a great thing.

ELLIOT

There's another reason. I've never said it out loud.

STEVE

I think I have an idea, Elliot.

ELLIOT

The kids. I love them more than anything. I would never, ever put them in any situation like we have all gone through. What kind of monster...

(All three brothers stare ahead in silent contemplation.)

(Blackout)

Act I

Scene 2

SETTING: The camp, a little later.

AT RISE: The camp is a little more set

up. All three brothers are now

seated.

STEVE

Should I break the awkward silence?

(Awkward silence)

I'll take that as a yes.

ELLIOT

Got any good ghost stories?

TUCKER

It's not dark yet.

ELLIOT

I wasn't aware of that rule.

TUCKER

Camping 101.

ELLIOT

That explains it, I took Cultural Anthropology in college instead.

STEVE

A joke!

(Suddenly, a big

rustling sound is heard.

Something is making a lot of noise coming through. ELLIOT, upon

hearing this, is

startled. Like someone who got a jump scare, then tried to play it

off.)

ELLIOT

BEARS!

TUCKER

Hide your spleen!

(STEVE and TUCKER remain unmoved.)

ROGER

(off-stage)

Hello?

TUCKER

(sarcastically)

Aaah, Elliot, they've learned to talk!

ROGER

(off-stage)

Don't worry, I'm not a bear!

TUCKER

(sarcastic eureka moment)

Exactly what a bear would say!

(During the exchange, STEVE, without saying a word, goes to unpack things with his back turned. On purpose. Enter Ranger ROGER, the head ranger at the park. He's all business.)

ROGER

Gentlemen, hello!

(TUCKER and ELLIOT wave, STEVE is doing busywork)

TUCKER

Howdy.

ROGER

I'm Ranger Roger Rogers, head ranger here. I'm going around checking things out, making sure everyone is having a lovely time today.

TUCKER

(giggling to himself) Ranger... Roger Rogers? Oh, please let your middle name be Rudolph. Or Randy!

(TUCKER is promptly ignored by everyone)

ELLIOT

Of course. We are having a lovely time.

ROGER

Good to hear. Did you happen to see the signs posted at the entrance to the park? About safety?

TUCKER

Oh, yes. Elliot here is quite the stickler for the rules. He may have even written them down for us to remember.

(ELLIOT looks annoyed)

ROGER

Excellent. Gold star for you, sir.

ELLIOT

Thanks?

ROGER

We're also reminding guests that there have been bear sightings.

ELLIOT

•••

ROGER

Nothing to worry about for the most part. Remember to lock up any food items you may have brought into the park. And cleaning up is always important.

TUCKER

Of course. Elliot here is bear-phobic.

ELLIOT

That is not a real thing.

TUCKER

It totally is.

(TUCKER looks over at ROGER who shakes his head "yes, it is.")

ROGER

Did you tell him scary bear stories as a child?

(TUCKER laughs, ELLIOT

does not. STEVE, in the

background, starts to

stand.)

I do not personally find that funny. Education is the best way to learn about bear safety, not through intimidation.

(ELLIOT is smug)

Sir, I assure you the chances are low that you will have a frightening experience with one of our bears. In fact, studies have shown that only 10%...

(ROGER sees STEVE fully and, uh, freaks out?)

Is... that? Oh, my...

(TUCKER has been waiting for this)

TUCKER

(very sarcastically) Oh, yes! Our big brother is the world famous magician Steven Sanderstone!

(As if by magic, ROGER drops all sense of seriousness and loses it. He runs over to STEVE, shaking his hand. This is nothing new to STEVE. Go nuts having fun with his overreaction.)

ROGER

STEVE

Hi.

TUCKER

(sarcastically)

Wow!

ROGER

I can't believe I am meeting you! I love you!

STEVE

Thanks.

ROGER

When you levitated over the Grand Canyon. Changed. My. Life!

TUCKER

(Muttering)

Mirrors.

STEVE

Thank you, that was a fun one. It took forever to plan.

ROGER

Don't tell me! I don't want to ruin the magic.

(STEVE throws his hands up and laughs.)

STEVE

No spoilers!

(ROGER is giddy laughing. STEVE is being friendly and laughing along. TUCKER is puzzled. ELLIOT just stands there.)

ROGER

My family is never going to believe this. Can we take a picture together?

TUCKER

He'd love to!

(ROGER hands TUCKER his phone and goes to pose with STEVE, who is playing along.)

TUCKER

Say 'Mirrors'!

ROGER

(Confused) Mirrors?

STEVE

(Angry)

Tucker.

(TUCKER takes the photo and hands it back to ROGER.)

ROGER

The world's greatest illusionist in our park. Wow.

STEVE

Wow.

ROGER

Wow!

TUCKER

(Mocking)

WOW!

(Both turn to look at him. ROGER then turns back.)

ROGER

I don't mean to spoil the mood. You know, I knew your dad. (Turns somewhat serious) I was so sorry to hear about what happened.

STEVE

Thank you.

ROGER

(Turning to TUCKER and

ELLIOT)

I'm sorry. He was such a great man.

TUCKER

Yeah...

ROGER

My father actually went to high school with him. He said they called him the big man on campus. He would always tell

me about how he was friends with the coolest guy on the planet.

(The brothers are now confused and looking at each other. Their dad? Seriously?)

Star athlete, ladies man--

TUCKER

That we did know.

ROGER

I first met him a few years ago down at Blarneys on Fifth. Shooting pool. A real shark, your dad was.

TUCKER

We also kind of knew that.

ROGER

Great guy. Always so friendly and welcoming. I loved to chat with him about the good old days. And, of course, his famous son.

(TUCKER turns to ELLIOT)

TUCKER

Of course.

ROGER

He really loved his family. More than anything. You couldn't get him to shut up about how proud he was of his family. And the pictures! Every time he would have a new photo of one of his grandchildren, he would show it off to everyone like a teenager showing off his new car.

(TUCKER continues to just look at ELLIOT)

I think everyone that knew him looked up to him as a father figure. He'd always have good advice to tell. He'd just know what to say to anyone having a hard time. Or give a few bucks to someone in need. It must have been a hoot having him as your father.

(STEVE and ELLIOT both give polite nods, while TUCKER turns around in the least subtle "what

the heck is he talking
about" motions.)

TUCKER

Are we talking about the same person? Harold Williams?

ROGER

Yes.

TUCKER

About my height. Balding. Goatee?

ROGER

That's him.

(TUCKER is dumbfounded and silent, so ROGER changes the subject.)

What brings you fellas out here?

STEVE

We're all going home Friday, just trying to get some brotherly time in.

ROGER

Great family. Your dad would be so happy to see this.

(TUCKER makes a gagging sound. Before anyone can react they are all scared, except ROGER.)

CHARLIE

(Off-stage and really,

really loud)

HELLO!

ALL BROTHERS

AH!

ROGER

Charlie, over here!

ELLIOT

What the...

TUCKER

Hell.

ROGER

Charlie Holland, our newest park ranger! She is a real jack of all trades. Like, all of them.

(CHARLIE enters carrying what appears to be a bootleg bear trap.
CHARLIE is loud. VERY loud. Like doesn't have an outside voice, which is perfect for the outside.)

CHARLIE

ROGER, SIR, FOUND ANOTHER ONE ABOUT HALF A MILE AWAY.

ROGER

Oh, geez.

STEVE

What is that?

(CHARLIE holds it up, smiling as if she just caught a giant fish.)

ROGER

Vigilante bear hunters. Awful bunch. I think. Never seen them. They make these traps. (To CHARLIE) Put it in the truck and mark it on the map.

ELLIOT

Safe, eh?

ROGER

99.7%

TUCKER

That's pretty good.

ELLIOT

And the other .03%?

ROGER

(Changing the subject)

So... Charlie ...

CHARLIE

YES?

STEVE

(Trying to be cute)

Well, we don't need to put a bell on you, do we?

CHARLIE

WHAT IS THAT SUPPOSED TO MEAN?

STEVE

Never mind.

CHARLIE

NO, MR. MAGIC MAN, TELL ME WHAT YOU MEANT?

STEVE

You know who I am?

CHARLIE

DOESN'T EVERYONE? (Looks him up and down) NOT IMPRESSED. YOU LOOK TALLER ON TV.

(STEVE is at a loss for words. This doesn't happen. He is used to strangers fawning over him.)

STEVE

Uh.

(TUCKER notices his brother is in trouble and comes to his defense.)

TUCKER

He's not used to beautiful people talking to him.

(CHARLIE just stares ahead.)

ELLIOT

Ranger Roger tells us you are a jack of all the trades. How does that work?

CHARLIE

(Still looking ahead.)

I LIKE TO EXPERIENCE THINGS. I HAVE HAD MANY JOBS.

TUCKER

Oh? How many?

(CHARLIE finally turns to face TUCKER.)

CHARLIE

INCLUDING THIS ONE? 73.

STEVE

Um.

TUCKER

Impressive. And cool.

CHARLIE

IS THAT SUPPOSED TO IMPRESS ME?

TUCKER

No?

CHARLIE

GOOD. YES, 73. AND I LEARNED SOMETHING IMPORTANT FROM EACH ONE. AND EACH ONE HAS BROUGHT ME TO THIS POINT AND TIME.

TUCKER

Inquiring minds.

CHARLIE

ROGER.

ROGER

(Laughs)

We have time. And people should get to know our newest park ranger.

CHARLIE

FINE. MY LAST JOB WAS A NIGHTCLUB MANAGER.

TUCKER

Explains the volume.

CHARLIE

BEFORE THAT I WAS A SHIP CHANDLER, TAFFY PULLER, DOG BOUNTY HUNTER, KIDDY POOL CLEANER, LOWER BACK MODEL, BUTTERFLY TRAINER, CHAMPION PUDDING MAKER, ZOMBIE MOANING VOICE ACTOR, DRAGON QUEEN LARPER, LICORICE MEASURER, FAKE PSYCHIC DETECTIVE, WEINER MOBILE DRIVER, ONE OF THOSE ANNOYING THEME PARK PHOTOGRAPHERS, BATHROOM TOUR GUIDE, COACHELLA FENCE GREASER, LOST EASTER EGG TRACKER, CHRISTIAN DEATH METAL POET, AIR FRYER CHEF, AMATUER CARD THROWER, ARBOR DAY CONSULTANT, COMMERCIAL JINGLE SINGER, SNOW GLOBE FILLER, CURLING CHEERLEADER, NUCLEAR POWER PLANT PARKING ATTENDANT, DOOMSDAY CLOCK ASSISTANT, RENT-A-GIRLFRIEND COORDINATOR, POKEMON MASTER, TAP WATER INFLUENCER, CHRISTMAS TREE UNDECORATOR, POLTERGEIST THERAPIST, ARM HAIR STYLIST, PARTICLE ACCELERATOR INTERN, ADULT MOVIE CRITIC, PIDGEON CAFE BARTENDER, TOMB RAIDER, PRO WRESTLING FASHION REPORTER, TOUPEE REMOVER, TAXICAB CONFEESOR, TOE NAIL DECORATOR.

(All of the brothers just stand there with their jaws on the floor. ROGER is laughing.)

YOU ASKED.

ELLIOT

What exactly is an 'arm hair stylist'?

TUCKER

A photographer?

(Everyone turns to look at TUCKER with an expression like 'that was the weirdest thing you picked out'?)

ROGER

Charlie, these men just lost their father. Didn't you do something in that field?

CHARLIE

YES, I WAS A CEMETERY DECORATOR.

ELLIOT

Oh, well, he was cremated.

CHARLIE

THOSE CAN BE DECORATED TOO.

STEVE

Uh...

ROGER

I think it's time for us to let these fine gentlemen back to their business.

CHARLIE

OF COURSE. (Looks at STEVE) GOODBYE.

(CHARLIE walks offstage. STEVE still stands still, a bit dumbfounded.)

STEVE

Uh...

ROGER

Again, I am sorry for your loss. And *(to STEVE)* if you need anything just let us know. Anything at all. Like (looks around) an extra tent?

TUCKER

We might just take you up on that.

(They shake hands)

ROGER

Anything at all. Stay safe, guys.

(ROGER walks off-stage)

TUCKER

Well, that was...

ELLIOT

Weird.

STEVE

Do you really think Charlie was a tomb raider?

TUCKER

I meant Roger. And what he said about dad.

ELLIOT

Where do we even start with that?

STEVE

We all knew he had a secret life...

TUCKER

Banging women.

ELLIOT

Tucker, gross.

TUCKER

What?! It's true.
